

Palomar Amateur Radio Club

Founded in 1936, the Palomar Amateur Radio Club now includes approximately 500 members. PARC members own a repeater site on Palomar Mtn. at 5,600 feet, providing coverage of 2,000 square miles of San Diego County and 100 miles out to sea. The autopatch on the 2m and 70cm repeaters allows members to place non-business calls to almost any phone in San Diego County.

The Club meets the first Wednesday of each month at the Carlsbad Safety Center. The social time begins at 7:00 PM with the meeting and presentation at 7:30 PM. Visitors are welcome. The talk-in frequency is 146.730.

In June, PARC participates in Field Day, a 24-hour emergency exercise. The club has a proud tradition of contest accomplishments as well as delivering a Field Day experience that is fun and educational.

The annual PARC picnic is held in late summer. Prizes are awarded by drawing tickets earned by participation in club activities throughout the year. Members enjoy great food, radio demonstrations and a hidden transmitter hunt.

PARC members are active in a variety of emergency and community service activities as well as contesting and passing traffic.

The Club's newsletter, Scope, is mailed each month to members' homes.

Want to be a ham radio operator?

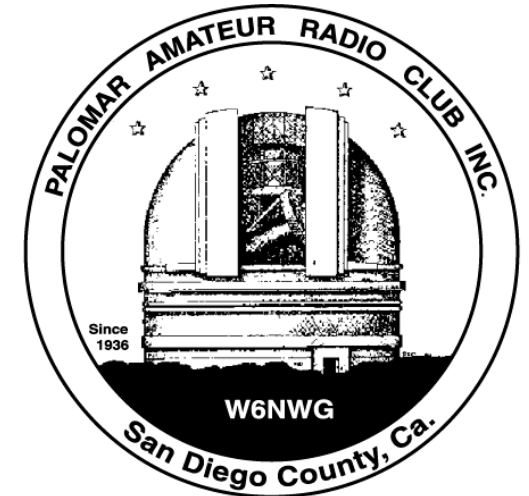
The Federal licensing requirements allow you to get your first-level Technician class license by passing a 35-question multiple choice test. Morse code is no longer required for this level of license. Study materials are readily available at Ham Radio Outlet and other electronics stores. The world wide web is an excellent source of information and practice tests.

Classes to prepare for licensing exams are provided by PARC and other organizations in San Diego County. We are very fortunate to have license exams administered almost every Saturday at various locations in the county. The PARC website lists more information (www.PalomarARC.org).

For those wishing to get more involved, higher licensing levels allow access to the worldwide bands. Imagine making contacts all over the world from your own radio with no dependence on phone, cellular, or internet! Better yet, those contacts are free once you have made the investment in your equipment.

Digital, satellite, and amateur television are also part of the hobby. Many operators are boaters who enjoy the benefits and safety of operating maritime mobile. Hikers use amateur radio to stay in contact in areas where cellular coverage is not available.
